**DOMESTIC SECTION 214 APPLICATION GRANTED FOR THE TRANSFER OF CONTROL  
OF PEG BANDWIDTH IL, LLC TO MIP IV MIDWEST FIBER, LLC**

**DOMESTIC SECTION 214 APPLICATION GRANTED FOR THE TRANSFER OF CONTROL  
OF MISSOURI NETWORK ALLIANCE, LLC D/B/A BLUEBIRD NETWORK TO  
MIP IV MIDWEST FIBER, LLC**

**WC Docket No. 19-50**

By this Public Notice, the Wireline Competition Bureau (Bureau) grants two applications requesting consent to transfer control of PEG Bandwidth IL, LLC (PEG Bandwidth), a wholly owned subsidiary of Uniti Fiber LLC,<sup>1</sup> and Missouri Network Alliance, LLC d/b/a Bluebird Network (MNA/Bluebird)<sup>2</sup> to MIP IV MidWest Fiber, LLC (MIP IV MW).<sup>3</sup>

On May 3, 2019, the Bureau released a Public Notice requesting comment on the PEG Bandwidth Application and the MNA/Bluebird Application.<sup>4</sup> On May 7, 2019, the U.S. Department of Justice, with the concurrence of the U.S. Department of Homeland Security and U.S. Department of Defense (collectively, the Executive Branch Agencies), filed a letter requesting that the Commission defer action on these proceedings while they completed their review of any national security, law enforcement, and public safety issues.<sup>5</sup> On May 8, 2019, the Executive Branch Agencies notified the Bureau that they

withdraw their request to defer action.<sup>6</sup> They state that, based on the information provided to them by the applicants and their analysis of potential national security, law enforcement, and public safety issues, they have no objection to the PEG Bandwidth Application and the MNA/Bluebird Application.<sup>7</sup>

No comments were filed in opposition to a grant of the PEG Bandwidth Application and the MNA/Bluebird Application, and the Bureau finds, upon consideration of the record, that granting these applications will serve the public interest, convenience, and necessity.<sup>8</sup> Pursuant to section 1.103 of the Commission's rules, 47 C.F.R. § 1.103, the grant is effective upon release of this Public Notice. Petitions for reconsideration under section 1.106 or applications for review under section 1.115 of the Commission's rules, 47 C.F.R. §§ 1.106, 1.115, may be filed within 30 days of the date of this Public Notice.
