Exhibit 1A is a copy of FAA Form 7460-1 that was submitted to the Federal Aviation Administration's Southern Regional Office.

Exhibit 1B is a section of an aeronautical chart showing the location of the proposed tower in reference to all airways and airports.

Exhibit 2 is a 7.5 minute topographic map depicting the proposed transmitter site. The map was published by the U.S. Geological Survey and shows all markings to verify the geographic coordinates of the proposed site.

Exhibit 3 is an Interference Statement addressing possible interference caused to nearby facilities.

Exhibit 4 is a vertical sketch of the supporting structure showing the proposed FM transmitting antenna and relevant elevation data.

Exhibit 5A is a combination of two 1:250,000 topographic maps showing the predicted service contours of the proposed Channel 289A operation and Exhibit 5B is a reduced version of the above maps. As shown, in Exhibit No. 5, the proposed 70 dBu contour will cover the entire boundaries of Baldwin as required by the provisions of Section 73.315(a) of the FCC Rules and Regulations.

Exhibit 6 is a separation study for Channel 289A from the proposed transmitter site. As indicated by this Exhibit, the proposed Channel 289A operation complies with Section 73.207 of the Rules and Regulations.

Exhibit 7 is a vertical plane relative field pattern of the proposed transmitting antenna.

Exhibit 8 is an FCC Report and Order establishing the window filing period for Channel 289A in Baldwin, Florida.

The applicant will install an auxiliary power generator to ensure that the station remains on the air should an interruption of commercial power occur.

Page 3 - Engineering Statement
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The population within the 1.0 mV/m contour is 104,425 persons. Population data were taken from the 1980 Census pamphlets published by the Department of Commerce. The land area within the 1.0 mV/m contour was computed to be 2510.7 square kilometers. A calibrated polar planimeter was used to check the area.

Part 73 of the FCC's Rules and Regulations are amended, effective January 1, 1986 to implement the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (NEPA). The rule amendment identifies human exposure to RF radiation as an issue for certain facilities regulated by the FCC. The proposed facility has been evaluated based on OST Bulletin No. 65 (October 1985) "Evaluating Compliance with FCC-Specified Guidelines for Human Exposure to Radiofrequency Radiation." Proposed radiation is in compliance with FCC-Specified Guidelines.




A computerized study was conducted to ascertain whether there are any broadcast and non-broadcast services that are located within 10 km of the proposed site. The results of that study show that there are many such facilities. The installation of the proposed FM antenna at the specified site is not expected to have any adverse effects on these or any other facilities. Should objectional interference be caused to other communication facilities as a direct result of constructing this facility, the applicant will take the necessary technical steps to resolve the issue of an adverse environment.

The applicant will address all complaints of alleged interference within its blanketing contour as established by Section 73.318 of the Rules and resolve such complaints satisfactory to the complainant provided the device that is malfunctioning is not excluded from the evaluation.






THREE BAY CIRCULARLY POLARIZED FM TRANSMITTING ANTENNA

By the Chief, Policy and Rules Division:

1. The Commission has before it for consideration the *Notice of Proposed Rule Making* in this proceeding proposing the allotment of Channel 227A to Baldwin, Florida. 2 FCC Rcd 2033 (1987). Casey Broadcasting Co., Inc. and Marlene V. Borman filed counterproposals. Radio Representatives, Inc. and Jones College filed supporting comments. General Broadcasting of Florida, Inc. filed a "Motion to Consolidate Proceedings." Casey Broadcasting Co., Inc., Emission Radio de Balmaseda, Inc., and General Broadcasting of Florida, Inc. filed reply comments. For the reasons discussed below, we are allotting Channel 289A to Baldwin, Florida, Channel 271A to Watertown, Florida, and Channel 227C2 to St.Marys, Georgia.

BACKGROUND

2. This proceeding began with the filing of a petition for rule making by Northeast Florida Radio, Inc. ("Northeast") proposing the allotment of Channel 287A to Fernandina Beach, Florida. Thereafter, Radio Representatives, Inc. ("RRI") filed a separate petition for rule making proposing a conflicting Channel 287A allotment at Baldwin, Florida. In order to provide for the possibility of allotting FM channels to both communities, we issued two *Notices of Proposed Rule Making*. The first *Notice* proposed the allotment of Channel 287A to Fernandina Beach, Florida. 2 FCC Rcd 741 (1987). In the separate *Notice* in this proceeding, we proposed the allotment of Channel 227A to Baldwin instead of Channel 287A in order to accommodate Channel 287A at Fernandina Beach. This procedure avoided the need to institute a comparative rule making proceeding with respect to the conflicting rule making petitions for Channel 287A at Baldwin and Fernandina Beach, Florida.

3. Prior to the adoption of *Notices* for Baldwin and Fernandina Beach, we adopted a *Report and Order* in MM Docket No. 85-376 allotting Channel 293A to Ponte Vedra Beach, Florida. 2 FCC Rcd 1182 (1987). In response to the *Notice of Proposed Rule Making* in MM

Docket No. 85-376 proposing the allotment of Channel 293A to Ponte Vedra Beach. General Broadcasting of Florida, Inc. ("General Broadcasting"), licensee of Station WCAT-FM, Channel 294C1, Leesburg, Florida, filed a counterproposal proposing the allotment of Channel 227A to Ponte Vedra Beach. In its counterproposal, General Broadcasting stated that the proposed allotment of Channel 293A to Ponte Vedra Beach would preclude grant of its application to maintain full Class C status at Station WCAT-FM (File No. BPH-860310II). In denying the General Broadcasting counterproposal, we noted that a Channel 227A allotment at Ponte Vedra Beach would preclude a Channel 227A allotment at Baldwin. Shortly thereafter, we adopted a *Notice of Proposed Rule Making* in MM Docket No. 87-77 proposing Channel 227A for Baldwin. General Broadcasting filed a petition for reconsideration directed against the *Report and Order* allotting Channel 293A to Ponte Vedra Beach, Florida.

4. General Broadcasting filed comments and a "Motion to Consolidate Proceedings." In its comments, General Broadcasting refers to its petition for reconsideration in the Ponte Vedra Beach proceeding. General Broadcasting suggests that Channel 223A be allotted to Ponte Vedra Beach in order that Channel 227A may be allotted to Baldwin and that Channel 287A may be allotted to Fernandina Beach. This would, in turn, permit grant of its application to maintain full Class C status at Station WCAT-FM. To achieve this result, General Broadcasting requests that the docketed proceedings for Ponte Vedra Beach, Baldwin and Fernandina Beach be consolidated.

5. Casey Broadcasting Co., Inc. ("Casey"), licensee of Station WLKC, Channel 228A, St.Marys, Georgia, filed a counterproposal.² This counterproposal proposed the substitution of Channel 227C2 for Channel 228A at St. Marys and modification of the Station WLKC license to specify operation on Channel 227C2. In its counterproposal, Casey states that its proposed Channel 227C2 upgrade would enable Station WLKC to serve approximately 433,556 more persons. In order to accommodate its upgrade and a new allotment at Baldwin, Casey proposes alternate Channel 289A for Baldwin. To allot Channel 289A to Baldwin, it was necessary for Casey to propose the substitution of Channel 271A for Channel 289A at Watertown, Florida.

DISCUSSION

6. We dismiss the "Motion to Consolidate Proceedings" filed by General Broadcasting because General Broadcasting would no longer be aggrieved by any allotment that we may make to Baldwin, Fernandina Beach or Ponte Vedra Beach. On May 10, 1988, General Broadcasting amended its application, which had originally proposed to maintain full Class C status for Station WCAT-FM, to specify Class C1 facilities. The amended application was granted on June 7, 1988. As a result of that action, the Table of FM Allotments is amended to reflect a Class C1 allotment for Leesburg. *See Reclassification of FM Facilities Pursuant to Broadcast Docket No. 80 - 90*, 2 FCC Rcd 2124 (1987). After the Table is amended, the prescribed procedure for General Broadcasting to attain Class C status for Station WCAT-FM would be to file a petition for rule making. General Broadcasting has not done so. In fact, in its Petition for Leave to Amend in BPH-860310II, General Broadcasting stated that specifying Class C1 facilities would end "litigation surrounding retention of Gen-

eral's Class C status." As a result, General Broadcasting is not affected by any channel which we may allot at Baldwin, and there is no reason to consolidate any of these proceedings.

7. We will allot Channel 289A to Baldwin, Florida as a first local service.³ In order to allot Channel 289A to Baldwin, we are also substituting Channel 271A for Channel 289A at Watertown, Florida.⁴ In addition, we are substituting Channel 227C2 for Channel 228A at St. Marys, Georgia, and modifying the license of Station WLKC to specify operation on Channel 227C2.⁵ In a related context, we are dismissing the counterproposal filed by Marlene V. Borman proposing the allotment of Channel 227A for Orange Park, Florida. This counterproposal was filed on June 9, 1987. Section 1.420(d) of the Commission's Rules specifically requires counterproposals to be filed by the comment date in a rule making proceeding. Inasmuch as the comment date in this proceeding was June 1, 1987, this counterproposal was untimely and will not be considered. See *Ocilla, Georgia*, 3 FCC Rcd 4765 (1988).

8. Accordingly, pursuant to the authority found in Sections 4(i), 5(c)(1), 303(g) and (r) and 307(b) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, and Sections 0.61, 0.204(b) and 0.283 of the Commission's Rules, IT IS ORDERED. That effective **November 13, 1989**, the Table of FM Allotments, Section 73.202(b) of the Rules, IS AMENDED for the communities listed below, as follows:

9. IT IS FURTHERED ORDERED, That pursuant to Section 316(a) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, the license of Casey Broadcasting Co., Inc. for Station WLKC, St. Marys, Georgia, IS MODIFIED to specify operation on Channel 227C2 in lieu of Channel 228A, subject to the following conditions:

- (a) Within 90 days of the effective date of this Order, the licensee shall submit to the Commission a minor change application for a construction permit (Form 301), specifying the new facility;
- (b) Upon grant of the construction permit, program tests may be conducted in accordance with Section 73.1620; and
- (c) Nothing contained herein shall be construed to authorize a change in transmitter location or to avoid the necessity of filing an environmental impact statement pursuant to Section 1.1301 of the Commission's Rules.

10. The window period for filing applications for the Channel 289A allotment at Baldwin, Florida, will open on **November 14, 1989**, and close on **December 14, 1989**.

11. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, That the counterproposal filed by Marlene V. Borman to allot Channel 227A to Orange Park, Florida, IS DISMISSED.

12. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, That the "Motion to Consolidate Proceedings" filed by General Broadcasting of Florida, Inc. IS DISMISSED.
