MB Docket Nos. 18-119 and 18-227**

Dear Ms. Dortch:

On October 4, 2018, David Field, Chairman, President and Chief Executive Officer of Entercom Communications Corp. ("Entercom"), and I met with Chairman Pai and his Media Advisor, Alison Nemeth, to discuss certain issues raised in the above-captioned proceedings.

We discussed the FCC's Notice of Proposed Rulemaking in MB Docket No. 18-119 proposing certain changes to the FM translator interference complaint resolution process. Specifically, we reiterated our support of the Comments and Reply Comments filed by Beasley Media Group, LLC, et. al. in the proceeding.¹ We noted that the Commission should not adopt a 54 dBμ contour limit for remediation of FM translator interference complaints. We explained that if a contour limit is necessary, then the 42 dBμ contour is the more appropriate one to use to avoid detrimentally impacting full-service FM stations.

In connection with MB Docket No. 18-227, we expressed our support for further deregulation including the thoughtful consideration of the present ownership rules in light of both increased competition in the audio and advertising marketplaces from providers such as Amazon, Apple, Facebook, Google, Pandora, SiriusXM and Spotify.
