O R D E R

The following procedural schedule shall govern this proceeding:

- July 9, 1991** -- Exchange of preliminary engineering exhibits;
- July 23, 1991** -- Exchange of final exhibits;
- July 30, 1991** -- Notification of the names of witnesses to be cross-examined;
- August 6, 1991** -- Oppositions to witness notification
- August 20, 1991** -- Commencement of hearing, at 10:00 a.m., at the offices of the Commission, Washington, D.C.

By **May 10, 1991** , each applicant shall serve on every other applicant and the presiding officer a full and complete description of its integration proposal, identifying the principals who are to devote 20 hours or more each week to the day-to-day operation of the station, the duties to be performed, and a statement of claimed qualitative enhancement factors. Each applicant shall examine its application to ensure that all information relevant to the diversification criterion is fully reported. Then, as a part of the integration statement required herein, each applicant shall state that its diversification showing, as reported, is complete and accurate, or, if not, that an appropriate amendment will be filed.

The early exchange of this information among the applicants is designed to encourage the exploration of settlement possibilities. To the extent that any such settlements are achieved, this proceeding will be simplified. The presiding officer urges the applicants to engage in good faith efforts at an early date to fully or partially settle this case.
