American Personal Communications ("APC"), pursuant to Section 1.1206(a)(2) of the Commission's Rules, 47 C.F.R. § 1.1206(a)(2) (1991), hereby notifies the Commission that on March 5 and 6, 1992, representatives of APC discussed the above-referenced docket with the Commission's staff.

APC's discussion concerned proposals made by APC in General Docket 90-314 for the implementation of new personal communications services ("PCS") in the 1850-1990 MHz band and its proposals for accommodation of incumbent private operational fixed service microwave licensees in that band. APC discussed its continuing belief, based on exhaustive research under its experimental authorization, that PCS and incumbent microwave users can coexist in the 1850-1990 MHz band. APC also discussed methods by which some incumbent microwave users can be transitioned to new bands or other communications media while others continue to coexist with PCS in that band.
