
It is my understanding that on February 29, 2016, the Federal Communications Commission, issued a public notice for comments on the 2013 Signal Boosters Report and Order (WT Docket 10-4). Although the notice and comment period has concluded, the Commission has yet to announce any new rulemaking regarding signal booster technology.

Specifically, I am inquiring about the status of the Commission's decision to revisit the "personal-use restriction" for consumer signal boosters, which prevents businesses, public institutions, and other enterprises from purchasing and using consumer signal boosters. I also understand that this proposal has nearly unanimous support among wireless carriers, telecommunications industry groups, business/enterprise interests, and the public safety community.

Wilson Electronics LLC—a constituent company headquartered in Salt Lake City—is a leading manufacturer of consumer signal boosters and operates a manufacturing facility in St. George, Utah. This company has also expressed its support for the elimination of the personal-use restriction for consumer signal boosters.

I respectfully ask for an update on the Commission's proposal to revisit the 2013 Signal Booster Order, specifically the proposal to eliminate the personal-use restriction. Thank you for your assistance with regard to my request. I look forward to your response.
