**WT Docket No. 16-319, *Bresnan Communications, LLC, Request for Waiver***

Dear Ms. Dortch:

On December 21, 2016 the Wireless Telecommunications Bureau (“Bureau”) granted T-Mobile License LLC (“T-Mobile”) a waiver of Section 27.14(g)(1) of the rules in the above-referenced proceeding.<sup>1/</sup> The Waiver Letter required, among other things, that T-Mobile file a sworn statement by January 21, 2019, specifying the steps that it has taken to extend service to the Fort Peck Reservation.

T-Mobile has satisfied the 70 Percent Coverage Benchmark (as that term is defined in the Waiver Letter) in BEA 144, which includes the Fort Peck Reservation.<sup>2/</sup> As the notification of construction demonstrates, T-Mobile covers 73% of BEA 144, consistent with its 70 Percent Coverage Benchmark obligation. Attached to this letter is a sworn statement by Michael Simpson, Senior Vice President, Technology Procurement, Planning & Development of T-Mobile USA, Inc.<sup>3/</sup> As Mr. Simpson’s statement confirms, in meeting the 70 Percent Coverage Benchmark obligation, T-Mobile provides service to a majority of the Fort Peck Reservation. Mr. Simpson’s statement is supported by a map showing that coverage.

T-Mobile has deployed its 700 MHz spectrum to serve other Tribal areas in Montana as well. In particular, it has initiated service in portions of the Flathead, Blackfeet, Rocky Boy, and Crow Reservations. T-Mobile continues to deploy new 700 MHz facilities in the state of Montana and
