

WITHDRAWAL OF PETITION AND COMMENTS OF DANJON, INC.

Danjon, Inc. ("Danjon"), petitioner in the above-referenced proceeding for a new Class A Channel 284A at Prineville, Oregon, by its counsel, hereby withdraws its Petition for Rulemaking and its Comments in this proceeding.

Danjon has received the Comments of Highlakes Broadcasting Company, licensee of Radio Stations WRCO-AM and KIJK-FM, Prineville, Oregon which were filed by its attorney, David Tillotson. Danjon was unaware of the existence of these two stations and does not wish to be the third station in the market. Danjon questions whether Prineville could support an additional station and, furthermore, whether a Danjon station could successfully compete against **two** stations operated by a single broadcaster who is established in the marketplace.

Furthermore, Danjon has been served with a Counterproposal filed by one Schuyler H. Martin seeking a higher power channel


for his Sisters, Oregon station. Danjon is not inclined to contest this Counterproposal and does not want to obligate itself for additional engineering expense to determine the impact of the proposed channel change on its site availability prospects.

For the foregoing reasons, therefore, Danjon hereby withdraws its Petition for Rulemaking and its Comments in this proceeding and respectfully advises the Commission that it has no further interest in the allotment of Channel 284A (or Channel 271A) to Prineville, Oregon. It will not file an Application for such allotment if it is made by the Commission.

Danjon further states neither it nor its officers, directors or stockholders have received or will receive or have been promised or expect to be promised any consideration of any kind whatsoever in exchange for the withdrawal of Danjon's proposal for Prineville, Oregon.
