On October 10, 2017, John Burchett of Google Fiber Inc. and Julie Veach and the undersigned, both of Harris, Wiltshire & Grannis LLP, met with Lisa Hone, Daniel Kahn, Adam Copeland, Eric Ralph, Angelica Lao, and Nicole Desbois of the Wireline Competition Bureau, and Paul LaFontaine of the Office of Strategic Planning, to discuss the record in the above-captioned proceeding. We reiterated Google Fiber's position, as set out in its comments and reply comments, addressing, in particular, concerns expressed in the record that use of one-touch make-ready procedures might cause damage to existing facilities or violate labor agreements to which Google Fiber is not a party. We also discussed current developments from the BDAC working groups in which Google Fiber is participating. Finally, we briefly discussed whether the Commission has sources of authority that would enable it to grant attachment rights to providers that are not telecommunications providers or cable operators.
