
Dear Ms. Dortch:

On October 12, 2018, Jason Zimmer, Gerry Turner, Frederick Lubeley, Jeffrey Baenke, and Roberto Yanez of United States Cellular Corporation (“U.S. Cellular”) and the undersigned, on behalf of U.S. Cellular, spoke by telephone with Catherine Matraves, Katherine LoPiccato, Thuy Tran, Paul LaFontaine, Aleks Yankelovich, Matt Collins, Joel Rabinovitz and Charles Mathias of the FCC Wireless Telecommunications Bureau, Office of Strategic Planning, and Office of General Counsel. We discussed the data request issued to U.S. Cellular on October 3, 2018, by the Wireless Telecommunications Bureau in the above-referenced proceeding, including discussion of the scope of the request and the responsive data U.S. Cellular will be able to produce.

We agreed that U.S. Cellular will submit the data on a “rolling” basis as it is produced and now state that we anticipate being able to produce all the requested data which U.S. Cellular maintains and is able to produce by November 7, 2018.

In accordance with Section 1.1206 of the Commission’s rules, 47 C.F.R. § 1.1206, this letter is being filed electronically for inclusion in the public record.
