I AM THE STATION MANAGER FOR KUZU-LP DENTON, TEXAS. WE SIGNED ON IN JULY OF 2017 AND OPERATE ON CHANNEL 225, 92.9 FM.

ALTHOUGH WE HAVE NO OBJECTIONS TO THE AMENDMENTS, WE DO IMPLORE THE COMMISSION TO RECONSIDER AND FURTHER DISCUSS AN INCREASE IN POWER OF LPFM STATIONS, SIMILAR TO THE LP-250 PROPOSAL.

OUR STATION, AS AN EXAMPLE, HAS A CO-CHANNEL FULL POWER STATION 90 MILES TO THE NORTH WEST AND ANOTHER CO-CHANNEL STA FM TRANSLATOR STATION 30 MILES TO THE SOUTH, BOTH OF THESE STATIONS CAUSE INTERFERENCE WITHIN OUR 60 DBU CONTOUR. RAISING THE CAP ON LPFMS COULD ALLOW US TO FULFILL OUR OBLIGATIONS TO OUR BROADCAST AREA, BY RELIEVING ISSUES OF PENETRATION AND INTERFERENCE.

WE ARE ACTIVELY ENGAGED IN OUR COMMUNITY AND CONSIDER KUZU-LP TO BE A LOCAL RADIO STATION AS THE F.C.C. INTENDED WITH THE GRANT OF OUR LICENSE. WE HAVE TRAINED OVER 80 LOCAL CITIZENS AND THEY PRODUCE ORIGINAL PROGRAMMING DAILY AS RADIO REPRESENTATIVES OF OUR CITY. WE HAVE BEEN ON THE AIR FOR 2 YEARS AND WE INTEND TO CONTINUE TO INVEST IN RADIO AND OUR LOCAL COMMUNITY.
