**STATEMENT OF POLICY IN TREATMENT OF  
CUSTOMER PROPRIETARY NETWORK INFORMATION**

1. It is Dynalink Communications, Inc. (hereafter referred to as "Dynalink Communications") policy not to use CPNI for any activity other than permitted by law. Any disclosure of CPNI to other parties (such as affiliates, vendors, and agents) occurs only if it is necessary to conduct a legitimate business activity related to the services already provided by the company to the customer. If the Company is not required by law to disclose the CPNI or if the intended use does not fall within one of the carve outs, the Company will first obtain the customer's consent prior to using CPNI.
2. Dynalink Communications follows industry-standard practices to prevent unauthorized access to CPNI by a person other than the subscriber or Dynalink Communications. However, Dynalink Communications cannot guarantee that these practices will prevent every unauthorized attempt to access, use, or disclose personally identifiable information. Therefore:
  - A. If an unauthorized disclosure were to occur, Dynalink Communications shall provide notification of the breach within seven (7) days to the United States Secret Service ("USSS") and the Federal Bureau of Investigation ("FBI").
  - B. Dynalink Communications shall wait an additional seven (7) days from its government notice prior to notifying the affected customers of the breach.
  - C. Notwithstanding the provisions in subparagraph B above, Dynalink Communications shall not wait the additional seven (7) days to notify its customers if Dynalink Communications determines there is an immediate risk of irreparable harm to the customers.
  - D. Dynalink Communications shall maintain records of discovered breaches for a period of at least two (2) years.
3. All employees will be trained as to when they are, and are not, authorized to use CPNI upon employment with the Company.
  - A. Specifically, Dynalink Communications shall prohibit its personnel from releasing CPNI based upon a customer-initiated telephone call except under the following three (3) circumstances:
    1. When the customer has pre-established a password.
    2. When the information requested by the customer is to be sent to the customer's address or email of record, or

3. When Dynalink Communications calls the customer's telephone number of record and discusses the information with the party initially identified by customer when service was initiated.

A. Dynalink Communications may use CPNI for the following purposes:

- To initiate, render, maintain, repair, bill and collect for services;
- To protect its property rights; or to protect its subscribers or other carriers from fraudulent, abusive, or the unlawful use of, or subscription to, such services;
- To provide inbound telemarketing, referral or administrative services to the customer during a customer initiated call and with the customer's informed consent.
- To market additional services to customers that are within the same categories of service to which the customer already subscribes;
- To market services formerly known as adjunct-to-basic services; and
- To market additional services to customers with the receipt of informed consent via the use of opt-in or opt-out, as applicable.

4. Prior to allowing access to Customers' individually identifiable CPNI to Dynalink Communications's affiliates, joint venturers or independent contractors, shall obtain opt-in consent from a customer prior to disclosing the information. In addition, Dynalink Communications requires all outside Dealers and Agents to acknowledge and certify that they may only use CPNI for the purpose for which that information has been provided.

5. Dynalink Communications does not market, share or otherwise sell CPNI information to any third party.

6. Dynalink Communications maintains a record of its own and its affiliates' sales and marketing campaigns that use Dynalink Communications's customers' CPNI. The record will include a description of each campaign, the specific CPNI that was used in the campaign, and what products and services were offered as part of the campaign.

A. Prior commencement of a sales or marketing campaign that utilizes CPNI, Dynalink Communications establishes the status of a customer's CPNI approval. The following sets forth the procedure followed by Dynalink Communications.

- Prior to any solicitation for customer approval, Dynalink Communications will notify customers of their right to restrict the use of, disclosure of, and access to their CPNI.
- Dynalink Communications will use opt-in approval for any instance in which Dynalink Communications must obtain customer approval prior to using, disclosing, or permitting access to CPNI.
- A customer's approval or disapproval remains in effect until the customer revokes or limits such approval or disapproval.

- Records of approvals are maintained for at least one year.
- The content of Dynalink Communications's CPNI notices comply with FCC rule 64.2008 (c).

7. . We have it on the contract, which the customer signs, prior to establishing service.
8. Dynalink Communications may negotiate alternative authentication procedures for services that Dynalink Communications provides to business customers that have a dedicated account representative and a contract that specifically addresses Dynalink Communications's protection of CPNI.
