Dear Ms. Dortch:

On October 21, Dr. Henry Samueli, Chairman of the Board of Broadcom Inc.; Vijay Nagarajan, Vice President, Wireless Communications and Connectivity Division, Broadcom Inc.; Kevin Starkey, Vice President and Chief Operations Officer of Anaheim Area Management; and Mike Beteag, Chief Technology Officer, H&S Ventures, met with FCC Chairman Ajit Pai at the Honda Center in Anaheim, California to discuss the role of Wi-Fi in serving stadiums and other high-density environments, to explain the significance of Wi-Fi 6, and to reiterate Broadcom's support for opening the 6 GHz band to unlicensed technologies.

The discussion highlighted the importance of unlicensed spectrum for network connectivity at sporting events and large venues, and the importance of identifying larger channels to support the throughput and latency needs in high-density environments such as the Honda Center. Dr. Samueli emphasized that Chairman Pai's proposal to open the full 6 GHz band to unlicensed technologies is critical to accelerating deployment of Wi-Fi 6 and 5G services in the U.S. and maintaining U.S. leadership in mobile technology.
