Dear Ms. Secretary:

On May 28, 1992, Messrs. Wayne Schelle, Chairman of American Personal Communications, Inc., Mr. Martin Cohen, Vice President of The Washington Post Company, who are partners in American PCS, L.P. ("APC"), accompanied by Ms. Janice Obuchowski, communications consultant to the partnership, and Jonathan D. Blake, its legal counsel, met with Commissioner Sherrie P. Marshall, her senior advisor, Stevenson S. Kaminer, and legal advisor, Kathleen Q. Abernathy. The topics discussed were the emerging technologies proceeding and the personal communications services inquiry.

APC addressed issues raised by representatives of certain microwave users in the 1.85-1.99 GHz band who have expressed concerns before both the FCC and Congress about some of the proposals in the emerging technologies proceeding. APC urged that there are effective ways (a) to enable PCS licensees to utilize vacant frequencies in the 1850-1990 MHz band to reach for the exciting potential of these new services, without causing interference to or otherwise harming existing microwave users in that band, and (b) to provide for relocation of incumbent microwave users where it is necessary, they can find a suitable home elsewhere and their reasonable relocation costs are fully reimbursed. There was also some discussion of positions APC has set forth in its various pleadings in the PCS inquiry.
