On February 27, 2018, Brian Huseman, Charlie Kindel, and Darren Achord of Amazon met with Commissioner Michael O’Rielly and Legal Advisor Erin McGrath, and with Commissioner Jessica Rosenworcel and Legal Advisor Umair Javed. During the meetings, Mr. Achord discussed how additional spectrum resources, especially in the 3.5 GHz and 6 GHz bands, can benefit consumers by making more spectrum available for unlicensed and shared uses. The Amazon representatives commended the Commission for maintaining unlicensed use in the 64-71 GHz band and for examining bands above 95 GHz. Lastly, the parties urged the Commission to move forward on its spectrum agenda.
