Dear Ms. Dortch:

On Monday, March 6, 2017, Clare Liedquist and Donald L. Herman Jr. (via telephone), on behalf of Adams Telcom Inc., Central Texas Communications, Inc., E.N.M.R. Telephone Cooperative, Louisiana Competitive Telecommunications, Inc. and Pine Belt Communications, Inc. (collectively the “Rural LMDS Licensees”), met with Erin McGrath, Legal Advisor to Federal Communications Commission (“FCC” or “Commission”) Commissioner Michael O’Rielly to discuss the Rural LMDS Licensees’ positions in the above-referenced proceeding.

During the meeting, the Rural LMDS Licensees provided an overview of their history in the 28 GHz band, including the purchase of Basic Trading Area (“BTA”) licenses for Local Multipoint Distribution Services (“LMDS”) in 1998 and the continued investment in and operation of LMDS licenses thereafter. The Rural LMDS Licensees reiterated proposals made in their Reply to Oppositions to the Petitions for Reconsideration and in their own Petition for Reconsideration in the above-captioned proceeding with respect to license size and performance

requirements.¹ The Rural LMDS Licensees also expressed concern that some satellite petitioners appear to be using this proceeding to encroach on existing rights already afforded to terrestrial license holders in the millimeter bands.
