Dear Ms. Dortch:

More than 75 broadcasters and state broadcast association representatives from 38 states, accompanied by the undersigned of the National Association of Broadcasters, visited the Commission on March 2, 2017 for meetings with Alison Nemeth of Chairman Ajit Pai's office, J. David Grossman of Commissioner Mignon Clyburn's office, and Robin Colwell of Commissioner Michael O'Rielly's office. The broadcasters whose names appear at the end of this letter shared information about their local communities highlighting the need for changes to the Commission's broadcast ownership limits and their concerns about the Commission's current spectrum auction repacking plan.

Broadcast owners, managers and state association members thanked the Commission for their attention to issues that affect broadcasters. Representatives from Washington to Nebraska and Connecticut to Florida described ownership combinations and sharing arrangements that have allowed broadcasters to reduce infrastructure costs and invest in increased high-quality local coverage – in some cases revitalizing entire communities that felt forgotten. They also talked about the increasingly urgent need to ensure the competitiveness and viability of local news outlets, as newspapers continue to decline. Most of these examples, however, were possible only through a waiver of current Commission rules. Broadcasters hope the FCC will revise its rules so that more communities can benefit from these types of arrangements.


Attendees also expressed concern that the Commission's schedule for repacking television stations following the close of the broadcast spectrum incentive auction will fail to protect

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viewers from service losses. They noted the apparent lack of flexibility or contingency plans for extreme weather, resource constraints, the high number of translators that will need to be repacked, and potential costs significantly exceeding the \$1.75 billion in available reimbursement funds. Broadcasters also noted that radio antennas are frequently co-located on the same towers with television antennas and the Commission has not provided information about how the repack will impact those radio stations or how the Commission will protect listeners from service losses during repacking.

Finally, broadcasters noted their continued frustration with the large number of pirate radio operations. One broadcaster noted that, on a recent afternoon in Upper Manhattan, he picked up 14 pirate stations on his tuner. The broadcasters urged the Commission to devote the time and resources needed to effectively address this serious problem.
