During the call, we discussed the Commission's White Spaces proceedings. Specifically, we requested that the Commission resolve pending petitions for reconsideration in the above referenced proceedings, issue an order in the pending database accuracy proceeding, reiterate the requirement that facilities that operate wireless medical telemetry devices to register those devices, replace the existing "push" notification rule with a technologically feasible alternative, and propose the rule changes described in detail in Microsoft's *ex parte* filing dated October 2, 2018.¹
