AT&T Services, Inc. on behalf of its affiliates AT&T Corp., Pacific Bell Telephone Company d/b/a AT&T California, SBC Long Distance, LLC d/b/a AT&T Long Distance and Teleport Communications America, LLC, collectively referenced herein as "AT&T", filed an application seeking emergency authorization under Section 214(a) of the Communications Act, as amended ("the Act"), 47 U.S.C. § 214, and Section 63.63 of the Federal Communications Commission's ("Commission") rules, to suspend AT&T's interstate telecommunications services until services could be restored as a result of the Woolsey and Hill Wildfires ("the Fires") in Los Angeles and Ventura Counties in Southern California, which effected 4 AT&T Wire Centers.

AT&T hereby informs the FCC that AT&T has restored service to all customers that reported service issues due to the Fires. Services have been restored either through temporary or permanent facilities throughout the impacted areas. In addition, AT&T's service levels have normalized and are being sustained. As a result, AT&T no longer requires authorization pursuant to Section 63.63 to suspend its services in these areas.
