MEMORANDUM OPINION AND ORDER

Issued: June 9, 1992;

Released: June 10, 1992

1. The Bible Broadcasting Network, Inc. (BBN) seeks a ruling on a Petition for Leave to Amend. They filed their petition on May 26, 1992, and it stands unopposed.¹

2. BBN wants to report: (a) that on April 29, 1992, they consummated the assignment of WAVO(AM), Decatur, Alabama to Curriculum Development Foundation, Inc.; (b) that this assignment was authorized by the Commission on March 30, 1992 (BAL-920213EC); (c) that they have corrected an error; namely, that they had previously failed to report the filing and grant of BAL-920213EC, but updated their application on May 1, 1992; (d) that on April 5, 1992 certain specified changes were made in BBN's Board of Directors²; and (e) that the pending Settlement Agreement leading to the dismissal of BBN's FM application for Martinez, Georgia was consummated on April 23, 1992, and Exhibits 4 was amended to reflect that that application is now dismissed.

Ruling


3. BBN's unopposed petition will be granted and the amendment accepted. It's wise for an applicant in hearing to update his application early-on. That's good cause.

¹ Any comments, on or oppositions to BBN's petition were due on or before June 4, 1992.

² BBN cannot obtain any comparative advantage from these specified changes. Indeed, they will also be charged with any comparative deterioration resulting from such changes. See FCC 92M-583, released May 20, 1992.
