Dear Ms. Dortch:

On March 24, 2017, Linda Kinney, Todd Rallison, Robert Paxman, and John Roman (the latter three by telephone) from Intel Corp., along with Paul Sinderbrand, counsel to Intel Corp., met with Julius Knapp, Bruce Romano, Jamison Prime, Brian Butler, Rashmi Doshi and William Hurst (the latter two by telephone) of the Commission's Office of Engineering and Technology.

During the course of the meeting, the Intel representatives addressed the Commission's pending *Notice of Proposed Rulemaking* in the above-referenced proceeding, with a particular focus on proposals for modifying the equipment authorization rules to permit certification of a "family of devices" and for modifying the rules relating to device labeling. Copies of the attached document were distributed during the course of the meeting. The substance of Intel's comments is reflected in its earlier filings in this docket. In addition, Intel specifically proposed that, to accommodate smaller devices, reduce burdens on manufacturers, and eliminate potential consumer confusion, the labels required under Sections 2.803 and 2.805 be shortened to simply read "This device has not been authorized by the FCC."

Pursuant to Section 1.206 of the Commission's Rules, this letter is being filed electronically via the Electronic Comment Filing System in the above-referenced proceeding.
