On March 24, 2017, Richard Engelman, Director – Government Affairs, Spectrum, Gardner Foster, Senior Counsel – Government Affairs, and the undersigned of Sprint Corporation (“Sprint”) met in person with Nese Guendelsberger, Acting Chief, Wireless Telecommunications Bureau, James Schlichting, Senior Deputy Bureau Chief, Blaise Scinto, Chief, Broadband Division, John Schauble, Deputy Chief, Broadband Division, and Jonathan Campbell, Attorney-Advisor, Wireless Bureau and by phone with Nancy Zaczek, Special Counsel, Broadband Division and Nadja Sodos-Wallace, Attorney-Advisor, Broadband Division.

Sprint representatives discussed its extensive build-out and use of the 2.5 GHz band in the deployment of its nationwide network and the reliance it places on the 2.5 GHz band to provide advanced wireless broadband LTE service to its customers. Sprint also expressed its support for the Wireless Communications Association (“WCA”), the National EBS Association (“NEBSA”) and the Catholic Television Network’s (“CTN”) joint 2.5 GHz Consensus Plan proposal to license available Educational Broadband Service (“EBS”) “white space” spectrum more extensively.

Pursuant to Section 1.1206 of the Commission's Rules, Sprint hereby files this *ex parte* letter into the docket of the above-referenced proceeding.
