Dear Ms Searsy,

I am writing this letter to advise you of my objection to "Billed Party Preference". I understand that this concept is under consideration and I believe that you have accomplished this with your current regulations that the consumer can get his/hers carrier of choice now.

We operate one Truck Stop and two Restaurants, serving the traveling public on our Interstate and Federal Highway System. At this time we are receiving a reasonable return on our space for our pay telephones. We now are able to sign up with many various telephone providers, which give us commissions for the space, location, heat, air-conditions, maintenance, cleaning of these pay phones. This is all possible because we, as property owners are the ones that determine who the primary long distant carrier will be for our particular location. Even with this choice the public that uses our phones can use the carrier of choice by dialing 800 or excess numbers 10 XXX codes ect.

If you pass regulations so the user of these phones have to determine which carrier they use each and every time they make a long distant call the following will happen:

- We will loose our current commission payment. This will happen because "we no longer control the usage or carrier of the phone."
- We will then cut down the number of phones at our facilities to the bare minimum. Elimination of all phones in our restaurant booths. This will then cut both the availability and quality of service.
- You will increase the time and confusion that already exist to some extent. (We have worked very hard to clear the actual phone usage problems since deregulation and phone subscription regulations).

I HOPE THAT YOU RECONSIDER YOUR POSITION ON "BILLED PARTY PREFERENCE" AND THAT YOU DO NOT IMPLEMENT ANOTHER UNNEEDED REGULATION.
