STATEMENT IN SUPPORT OF WAIVER

Although the Mercer County Board of Education approved the necessary contracts on 03/26/2019, FCC Forms 471 #191030333 and #191034672 were not certified until 03/29/2019 because the authorized signer was unavailable until that date. Since the applications were certified within two (2) days after the close of the FY2019 Window, which was well within the 14 day grace period granted by the Commission in recent years, Mercer respectfully requests the Commission to grant it a Waiver of the filing deadline and allow FCC Forms 471 #191030333 and #191034672 considered for funding as though timely filed within the Window. Mercer did its best to comply with all E-rate rules and intends no fraud, abuse or waste of program funds.

The Commission has repeatedly reiterated its authority under 47 C.F.R. §1.3 to waive rules for good cause shown and may exercise its discretion to waive a rule where the particular facts make strict compliance inconsistent with the public interest. See, *Northeast Cellular Telephone Co. v. FCC*, 897 F.2d 1164, 1166 (D.C. Cir. 1990). Additionally, the Commission may take into account considerations of hardship, equity, or more effective implementation of overall policy on an individual basis. *WAIT Radio v. FCC*, 418 F.2d 1153, 1159 (D.C. Cir. 1969); *Northeast Cellular*, supra.

Under the circumstances, a Waiver from the Commission will best serve the public interest and the interests of the students of the Mercer County School District.
