On April 4th, Sprint Corporation ("Sprint") representatives Scott Freiermuth, Mike Ellis, Todd Williams, and Claudia Gordon along with outside counsel Emily Daniels of Lawler, Metzger, Keeney & Logan, LLC, had a teleconference phone call with Bob Aldrich, Eliot Greenwald and Michael Scott from the Consumer and Governmental Affairs Bureau ("CGB").
