RE Notice of Discontinuance of Common Carrier Broadband Internet Access Transmission as a Separate Service Under Tariff

GN Docket No. 14-28; CC Docket No. 02-33; WC Docket No. 10-90

Dear Ms. Monteith:

Pursuant to the 2006 *Wireline Broadband Classification Order*¹ and the *Open Internet Order*², Michigan Central Broadband Company, Study Area Code 310785, is hereby providing the FCC with the attached notice of the Company's intention to cease offering broadband Internet access transmission service as a separate component of its broadband Internet access service, effective July 2, 2019. As such, broadband Internet transmission will only be furnished as part of a complete broadband Internet access service that the Company provides to its end users either through itself or its affiliate. Michigan Central Broadband Company makes this election on sixty (60) days-notice as prescribed in the 2016 *Rate-of-Return Reform Order*.³

Michigan Central Broadband Company currently provides broadband Internet access transmission services pursuant to the terms and conditions of the National Exchange Carrier Association's Tariff No. 5. Presently the only customer of the Company's broadband Internet access transmission service is the Company's affiliate ISP. The Company has provided notice to its ISP affiliate via interoffice memorandum of its intention to cease offering broadband Internet access transmission service as a separate component of its Internet access service effective July 2, 2019.

A copy of this notice is also being sent to the Michigan Public Service Commission, the Governor of Michigan, and the Special Assistant for Telecommunications at the Department of Defense.

RE: Notice of Detariffing and Discontinuance of Broadband Internet Access Transmission and Consumer Broadband-Only Loop Service as a Separate Service

This is to notify you of a change in the way in which Michigan Central Broadband provides broadband Internet access transmission and CBOL service, which is used as an input for the broadband Internet access services that you offer to residential and business end-user customers.

Presently, Michigan Central Broadband Company provides broadband Internet access transmission service under tariff through the National Exchange Carrier Association (NECA) Tariff F.C.C. No. 5. Effective July 2, 2019, Michigan Central Broadband Company will no longer offer its broadband Internet access transmission service under the NECA tariff, and will no longer offer wholesale broadband Internet access transmission as a separate standalone component of broadband Internet access service.

On and after July 2, 2019, broadband Internet transmission service will only be available to end user customers in conjunction with the Company's retail broadband Internet access service offering.
