On April 25, 2019, Josh Woodbridge, Amanda Potter and the undersigned met with Jerusha Burnett, Aaron Garza, Karen Schroeder, Kurt Schroeder, Mark Stone, and Kristi Thornton to provide an update on steps AT&T is taking to combat illegal robocalls.

AT&T continues to participate in and encourage upstream service providers to participate in the USTelcom Traceback Group. The group also continues to reduce cycle time between identifying, and taking action to mitigate, the bad robocalls. With respect to callerID authentication, AT&T stated that the Governance Authority is on track to announce the Policy Administrator in May and AT&T has started implementing Shaken/Stir. Additionally, AT&T continues to enhance the tools offered to consumers. Recently AT&T added to its suite of Call Protect services a free opt-out service that labels calls from telephone numbers identified with suspect or potentially unwanted sources for customers with eligible smart phones.
