Dear Ms. Searcy:

On behalf of Uhuru Communications, Inc., licensee of non-commercial educational FM broadcast station WUCI-FM, Binghamton, New York, we herewith request issuance of a Special Temporary Authority to remain off the air.

As background, on June 8, 1990, the licensee sent the enclosed letter to the Commission advising that due to circumstances beyond its control, the station temporarily discontinued operation.

Then on June 22, 1990, the licensee sent the enclosed letter requesting Special Temporary Authority to remain silent.

However, in reviewing the FCC records, we find no indication that the STA was received or granted. The licensee has not received any authorization from the FCC authorizing the station to remain silent.

Therefore, pursuant to 73.1740 of the Rules and Regulations, to the extent necessary, we request an STA to remain off the air.

Because the station is a non-commercial educational FM broadcast station, no filing fee is required in connection with this request.


Dear Licensee:

This letter concerns the request, filed March 26, 1991 by your attorney, to permit FM Station WUCI to remain silent.

As your attorney states, WUCI notified the Commission last June that the station discontinued operations as of June 1, 1990 "due to circumstances beyond our control" and requested temporary authorization later that month to remain silent beyond the thirty-day period provided in Section 73.1740 of the Commission's rules.

Accordingly, special temporary authorization is granted through July 1, 1991 to permit FM Station WUCI to remain silent. Please note that any prescribed tower lighting must be maintained during this period and that no extension of this authority is contemplated absent detailed substantial progress towards resolution of the station's problems.

DECLARATION OF CHARLES F. MULVEY

I, Charles F. Mulvey, hereby declare as follows:

1. I am an officer and employee of WSKG Public Telecommunications Council ("WSKG"). Until July 6, 1992, my position was Vice President for Engineering and my responsibilities included oversight of all engineering and physical plant matters for WSKG. Now my position is Vice President for Broadcast Technology and my responsibilities include new projects in the technical area, such as installation of new broadcast facilities.

2. I reaffirm each and every statement of the attached copy of my Declaration under penalty of perjury, dated April 26, 1991. All the statements in my Declaration of April 26, 1991 are true and correct.

3. Upon information and belief, Uhuru Communications, Inc. has not returned Station WUCI-FM to the air. I base this statement on my personal knowledge of broadcasting and broadcasters in Binghamton, New York and my attempt today to tune in Channel 218, 91.5 MHz on my radio receiver in Vestal, New York. No station is transmitting on Channel 218 in this area.

DECLARATION

I, Charles F. Mulvey, hereby declare as follows:

1. I am an employee of WSKG Public Telecommunications Council in the position of Vice President for Engineering. My responsibilities include oversight of all engineering and physical plant matters for the Council.

2. In the course of my duties, I oversee WSKG's storage of certain radio equipment pursuant to an agreement between WSKG and the United States Department of Commerce's National Telecommunications and Information Administration ("NTIA"). This equipment originally had been purchased by Uhuru Communications, for use with noncommercial educational FM Station WUCI-FM, Binghamton, New York, with funds disbursed by NTIA pursuant to a federal grant to Uhuru through NTIA's Public Telecommunications Facilities Program. A copy of WSKG's agreement with NTIA (the "WSKG/NTIA Agreement"), which includes, as Exhibit A, a list of equipment covered by the agreement, is attached.

3. NTIA informed WSKG, by letter of Dennis Connors to Michael J. Ziegler, dated September 26, 1990, that Uhuru had notified NTIA that it had no need for the equipment purchased with the PTFP funds. This equipment had been seized from WUCI by NTIA in August, 1990. The equipment was delivered to WSKG for storage on or about August 2, 1990. Subsequently, on August 17, 1990, WSKG and NTIA entered into the WSKG/NTIA agreement, under which WSKG agreed to continue to store this equipment at WSKG's facilities until December 31, 1990. On December 20, 1990, WSKG and NTIA extended the term of their agreement until June 30, 1991.

4. The WUCI equipment seized by NTIA has remained continuously in the possession of WSKG at its storage facilities from the date of delivery by NTIA to the present. Among other things, this equipment includes radio production equipment, microphones, an FM transmitter, exciter, two studio-transmitter link receivers and an Emergency Broadcast System receiver. All of these items are the pieces of equipment listed on the Exhibit A to the WSKG/NTIA Agreement.

5. On April 18, 1991, I visited the site of the tower from which WUCI was last known to operate after moving from the Stainless tower, their original transmitter site. This site is the Motorola tower located on Ingraham Hill in Binghamton, New York. This is the site from which part of the equipment seized by NTIA was located. The WUCI equipment shed is still at the site but electrical power is disconnected.

6. On or about April 22, 1991, I spoke by telephone with Gino Ricciardelli, an official of the owner of the Stainless tower at Ingraham Hill and he confirmed that WUCI terminated operation at that site in early 1989. The Stainless tower is the original and I believe the only authorized transmitter site of WUCI-FM from which they began broadcasting in 1986. A letter from Mr. Ricciardelli, dated April 23, 1991 confirming removal of the WUCI equipment is attached.

7. On April 23, 1991, at 2:56 p.m., I telephoned Billie Anderson at the Opportunities for Broome office (607/723-6493) located at 56 Whitney Avenue in Binghamton, New York. I had been informed that Ms. Anderson was the only person who had any knowledge of the WUCI public inspection file. Upon her answering the phone, I informed Ms. Anderson that I wished to see the WUCI public inspection file. Ms. Anderson asked my name and where I was from. I told her my name and that I was from WSKG. She responded that another person from WSKG had an appointment with her on May 1, 1991 and that I could meet with her at the same time to see the file. I told her I wished to see the file today and she replied that I could not see the file that day because she did not have the file. When I asked her who did have the file, she would not answer. I then told Ms. Anderson that, under the rules of the FCC, I was entitled to see the file upon request at any time during normal business hours, and that I wished to exercise this right. She responded angrily with a few comments such as "who do you think you are?" and then hung up the phone. I called right back and the person who then answered the phone asked my name. When I gave her my name, she told me that Billie Anderson could not accept my call as she was on her way to a meeting. I then asked the person on the phone to tell Ms. Anderson that I would visit her office on April 23 or April 24 and would request to see the WUCI public inspection file. The woman on the telephone said she would give Ms. Anderson my message.

8. On April 24, 1991, Mark Polovick and I visited the Opportunities for Broome office at 56 Whitney Avenue, Binghamton, New York at approximately 11:10 a.m. with the intention of seeing Ms. Billie Anderson and inspecting the WUCI public file. After a few minutes, Ms. Anderson entered the lobby of the building with the appearance of leaving the building. I told her I would like to see the WUCI public inspection file. She then responded I do not have it to show you. She further responded that someone from WSKG had an appointment with her to see the file on Wednesday (May 1, 1991). I then asked her if the WUCI public file existed and she responded that she did not have it.

Next, I asked if she knew where the public file was if it existed. Her response was that she had seven days in which to produce the file. I explained that the FCC's rules require that the public have immediate access to the file. Ms. Anderson was at that time moving towards the door, so I handed a complete copy of FCC Rule Section 73.3527 to the receptionist. Ms. Anderson watched me hand the pages to the receptionist. At this point, she asked if I had spoken with the president of the WUCI corporation, and I told her no. She replied that Mike Ziegler (of WSKG) had spoken with the president and that I should do so as well.

Dear Mr. Connors:

Pursuant to our previous conversations, please consider this a Letter of Agreement between the United States Department of Commerce National Telecommunications and Information Administration (hereafter "Department of Commerce") and WSKG Public Telecommunications Council (hereafter "WSKG"), P.O. Box 3000, Binghamton, NY 13902, wherein WSKG agrees to store for the Department of Commerce the equipment moved from WUCI pursuant to NTIA Grant Award No. 36-01-55387, attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit "A" is a listing of all equipment seized and a description of its condition (hereafter "equipment"), based upon the following terms and conditions:

1. The Department of Commerce warrants that it has the necessary authority and power to move and protect the equipment and store same at WSKG. While the equipment is in storage at WSKG facilities, the federal government's priority lien on the equipment purchased by Uhuru Communications, Inc. shall remain in effect (lien documents attached as Exhibit "B") and the government shall protect its interest. This storage agreement does not effectuate any transfer of title from Uhuru Communications, Inc. to WSKG or the Department of Commerce.
2. WSKG shall not be responsible for the damage, loss, theft, destruction, or other demise of any of the equipment, unless such loss is caused by WSKG's intentional or willful conduct. The Department of Commerce warrants that it is self-insured and WSKG shall not be responsible for insurance coverage.
3. Unless otherwise finally disposed or transferred, WSKG agrees to store the equipment at its facilities until December 31, 1990. After December 31, 1990, WSKG may require the immediate removal of said equipment.
4. WSKG shall not seek rental payments for the storage of the equipment, however, WSKG shall be reimbursed by the Department of Commerce for all direct and incidental costs and expenses arising from the storage of the equipment by WSKG.





This extension agreement amends item no. 3 of the original agreement, which reads:





Declaration of Mark Polovick



DECLARATION

I, Mark Polovick, hereby declare as follows:

1. I am an employee of WSKG Public Telecommunications Council in the position of Chief Engineer WSKG-TV/FM. My responsibilities include all operations and maintenance requirements for WSKG-TV & FM.

2. At 1:00 p.m. on April 18, 1991, Roger Sporre and myself arrived at 56 Whitney Avenue, Binghamton, New York, the building which had been identified per Charles Mulvey as the main studio for WUCI(FM). We asked the receptionist, Ms. Judy Fanara, to see the public inspection file of WUCI. The receptionist told us that "WUCI no longer existed". I then asked if anyone had access to the public inspection file of WUCI and the receptionist responded that a woman named Billie Anderson was the only person who would know where the file had been placed. The receptionist then told me that Billie Anderson was out of the office at the dentist and should return by 2:00 p.m. Roger and I left the building to return at 2:00 p.m.

3. Upon returning to the WUCI studio building, the receptionist, Ms. Judy Fanara, told us that Billie Anderson had not yet returned and that we could wait for her. When Billie Anderson had not returned by approximately 2:45, we asked Ms. Kelly Lynch (who was filling in for Ms. Fanara who was on her break) for a telephone number where we could reach Ms. Anderson. Ms. Lynch gave us the telephone number for an organization called Opportunities for Broome at (607) 723-6493. We left the building at 2:50 p.m.

4. I telephoned Opportunities for Broome at the number Ms. Lynch had provided at approximately 3:30 p.m. on April 18, 1991. Billie Anderson answered the phone and I identified myself as Mark Polovick. I asked her if I could come over to look at the WUCI public inspection file. She asked me what file I was talking about. I repeated that I wished to see the WUCI public inspection file. She then asked me by whose authority I was seeking to view the file. I stated that, in accordance with the FCC's rules, WUCI's public file was required to be available to any person who wished to see it and also informed her that I was an employee of WSKG. Ms. Anderson then told me that the WUCI files were not shown to anyone nor would there be any reason to show them to anyone. I told her thank you and ended the conversation.
