

INFORMATION DELIVERY SERVICE

1. General

1.1 Information Delivery Service consists of a serving arrangement which enables persons or entities, herein designated as sponsors, to provide program service to sponsors' clients. Sponsors are SWBT's customers for the Information Delivery Service offering. Each caller to an Information Delivery Service number is a client of the sponsor. A charge designated by the sponsor will apply to the client for each call to an Information Delivery Service number which is assigned to the sponsor by SWBT. Program sponsors applying for service under this tariff will, at SWBT's option, be provided either DIAL 976 service or given the option to subscribe to Special Prefix Information Delivery Service (SPIDS). Those sponsors who meet the regulations of a billing and collection contract for Information Delivery Service (the Contract) will be provided DIAL 976 service. Those sponsors who do not meet the regulations of the Contract will be given the option to subscribe to SPIDS.

1.2 DIAL 976 service is Information Delivery Service for which SWBT will provide billing of sponsors' charges to the client of the sponsor. (1) DIAL 976 service consists of a serving arrangement which enables sponsors to provide recorded announcements or recorded interactive program service to sponsors' clients. (2)

1.3 SPIDS is designated for those Information Delivery Service programs for which SWBT will not provide billing of sponsors charges to the sponsors' clients. SPIDS consists of a serving arrangement which enables sponsors to provide recorded or live announcement or recorded or live interactive program service. (3) Sponsors are SWBT's customers for the SPIDS offering. A charge designated by the sponsor may apply to the client for each call to an SPIDS number, however, SWBT will not bill this charge on behalf of the sponsor.

Access to SPIDS numbers will be provided only to end user customers local exchange lines which are located in the SPIDS market area and for which the end user customer has subscribed to SPIDS Access Service as specified in 7, following.

- (1) Pursuant to the Final Order in Docket 8030, charges and call details for all calls to DIAL 976 programs will be placed on a separate bill page of the calling party's SWBT bill. The initiation of this separate bill page for DIAL 976 calls will commence as soon as is reasonably possible, but in no event later than the customer's first billing period after June 30, 1989. Included on the separate bill page will be information explaining (a) that the customer is obligated to pay for the DIAL 976 calls but basic local service cannot be disconnected for nonpayment of such charges; (b) that nonpayment will result in mandatory blocking of DIAL 976 service, which carries a \$7.00 one-time charge; (c) that if the account is not paid, it may be turned over to a collection agent by the information provider; and (d) that there is an 800 service number for customers to call for general inquiries and comments about DIAL 976 service.
- (2) A recorded interactive DIAL 976 service program is a program whereby a sponsor's client through the use of a touch-tone pad or similar device can communicate with the sponsor's equipment for the purpose of selecting a particular recorded announcement.
- (3) A recorded interactive program for SPIDS is a program whereby a sponsor's client through the use of a touch-tone pad or similar device can communicate with the sponsor's equipment for the purpose of selecting a particular recorded or live program.

A13. MISCELLANEOUS SERVICE ARRANGEMENTS

A13.16 Local Calling Area Conference Service

A13.16.1 General

- A. Local conference service consists of furnishing connections, where and to the extent existing facilities permit, between three or more main stations or PBX trunks or combinations thereof at the same time, all within the same exchange or within exchanges having extended scope service to each other.
- B. Local conference service is offered only on a person-to-person basis as defined in Section A1 of this Tariff.
- C. Rules, regulations and timing applications for Toll Conference service found in Paragraph A18.4 of this Tariff will apply for Local Calling Area Conference service.

A13.16.2 Rates and Charges

- A. Initial Period Rates for the first three minutes or fraction will be \$1.80 for the first two telephones on a conference connection plus \$1.50 for each additional telephone number connected.
- B. Overtime rates per minute or fraction will be equal to the rate for a message toll call in the 0-10 mileage band.

A13.17 List Service

A13.17.1 General

- A. List Service is the matching of telephone numbers in written form to lists of names and addresses when such names and addresses are supplied to the Company by a subscriber according to a prescribed format. The use of the completed list by the subscriber will be restricted to telephone calling purposes. Nonpublished numbers will not be provided and the Company assumes no responsibility or liability for any errors that may appear in the completed list.

A13.18 Network Facilities for use with 976 Service

A13.18.1 General

- A. The 976 Service consists of a special arrangement for subscriber use to provide announcement and recorded program services within the local calling scope of the North Dade and Jacksonville exchanges. The subscriber may apply a charge to the caller for *certain calls* to a 976 number. The Company will bill these charges and apply a charge to the subscriber for transport and billing of the call. (C)
- B. A "subscriber" to the 976 Service provides information to the calling public by means of recorded announcements and may apply a charge to the caller for each local call completed to the subscriber's program from flat rate, measured rate or message rate telephones, or each Bell originated and transported intraLATA Toll or WATS call completed to the subscribers program or each Optional Extended Area Service call completed to the subscribers program. The Company agrees to provide billing on behalf of the subscriber. Each caller to a 976 service is a client of the subscriber. The subscriber is responsible for provision of service as described following. (C)

A13.18 Network Facilities for use with 976 Service (Cont'd)

A13.18.1 General (Cont'd)

- C. The Company will produce a record of the number of calls completed and billed as prescribed to each 976 telephone number and will issue a remittance check to the subscriber based on the difference between his charge for the billed call and the Company's charge to the subscriber, less uncollectable billings from prior periods. Where facilities permit, no calls will be permitted to a 976 number from Public or Semi-Public telephones or Non-LEC Pay Telephone Providers (PATS). No charge for a 976 call will be made by the subscriber and no remittance will be made to the subscriber for WATS calls or for toll calls originating from stations beyond the Local Calling Area of the exchange serving the subscriber's announcement location with the exception of Bell originated intraLATA toll calls. No third party or collect calls will be permitted to be billed to a 976 number and no customer dialed operator assisted calls will be permitted to be placed to a 976 number. (T)
- D. 976 Service will be provided under the following conditions:
1. The subscriber shall provide, via the 976 Network, continuous, uninterrupted automatic announcement and recorded program services. The customer-provided equipment will allow access to an announcement message by a calling party within a maximum of 30 seconds. This equipment will provide each call, an off-hook condition (answer supervision) at the beginning of each call and an on-hook condition (disconnect supervision) upon completion of a full announcement cycle time duration.
 2. Subscriber sponsorship of any particular announcement or recorded program service shall not preclude another subscriber from sponsoring the same or similar announcement.
 3. For network sizing and protection, each subscriber must provide an estimate of annual call volumes, the expected busy hour and busy hour call volumes, and holding time for each announcement.
 4. The provision of access to the 976 Network by the Company for the transmission of announcement or recorded program services is subject to availability of such facilities and the requirements of the local exchange and toll network. In no event shall the Company be liable for any losses or damages of any kind resulting from the unavailability or failure of its equipment or facilities or for any act, omission or failure of performance by the Company, or its employees, or agents, in connection with this Tariff. The Company shall not be responsible for calls that cannot be completed as a result of repair or maintenance difficulties on Company facilities and equipment nor on equipment owned by the subscriber.
 5. The location of the central office providing 976 Service in any exchange is entirely the selection of the Company.
 6. A written notice will be sent to any subscriber following oral notification when their service unreasonably interferes with or impairs other services rendered to the public by the Company or by other subscribers of 976 Service. If after notification the subscriber makes no modification in method of operation or in the service arrangements that are deemed service-protective by the Company, or if the subscriber is unwilling to accept the modifications, or if the subscriber continues to cause service impairment, the Company reserves the right, at any time without further notice, to institute protective measures, up to and including termination of service. In an emergency situation as defined by the Company, the Company reserves the right to discontinue service without advance notice.
 7. The subscriber assumes all financial responsibility for all costs involved in providing announcement or recorded program services including, but not limited to, the recorder-announcement equipment, producing the recordings, advertising and promotional expenses.

A13. MISCELLANEOUS SERVICE ARRANGEMENTS

A13.18 Network Facilities for use with 976 Service

A13.18.1 General

- A. 976 Service consists of a special arrangement for subscriber use to provide announcement and recorded program services within the local calling scopes of the Atlanta and Savannah exchanges. The subscriber may apply a charge to its client for announcements or services delivered in response to calls to a 976 number. The Company will bill these charges on behalf of the subscriber and apply a charge to the subscriber for transport and billing of the call.

A "client" of the subscriber is defined to be:

The calling party when 976 charges are applicable for Company originated and transported calls, or

The appropriate interexchange carrier when 976 calls are delivered by said carrier to a local 976 number.

A "subscriber" to 976 Service provides information to the calling public by means of recorded announcements and may apply a charge to its client for announcements or services delivered in response to:

Each local call completed to the subscriber's program from flat rate or certain message rate telephones.

Each Company originated and transported intraLATA toll or WATS call completed to the subscriber's program.

Each Optional Extended Area Service (OEAS) call completed to the subscriber's program.

Each call delivered by an interexchange carrier to the subscriber's program.

The Company agrees to provide billing on behalf of the subscriber. The subscriber is responsible for provision of service as described following.

The Company will produce a record of the number of calls completed and billed to clients of the subscriber for each 976 telephone number and will issue a remittance check to the subscriber based on the difference between his charge for the billed call and the Company's charge to the subscriber, less uncollectable billing from prior periods. No charge for a 976 call will be made by the subscriber, and no remittance will be made to the subscriber, for calls originating from mobile telephone stations within the local calling area. *Where facilities permit*, no calls will be permitted to a 976 number from *Public or Semi-Public telephones or four-party stations*. No customer dialed operator assisted calls will be permitted to be placed to a 976 number and no third party or collect toll calls will be permitted to be billed to a 976 number. (C)

976 Service will be provided under the following conditions:

1. The subscriber shall provide, via the 976 Network, continuous, uninterrupted automatic announcement and recorded program services. The customer-provided equipment will allow access to an announcement message by a calling party within a maximum of 30 seconds. This equipment will provide each call, an off-hook condition (answer supervision) at the beginning of each call and an on-hook condition (disconnect supervision) upon completion of a full announcement cycle time duration.
2. Subscriber sponsorship of any particular announcement or recorded program service shall not preclude another subscriber from sponsoring the same or similar announcement.
3. For network sizing and protection, each subscriber must provide an estimate of annual call volumes, the expected busy hour and busy hour call volumes, and holding time for each announcement.

18. SPONSOR PRICED AUDIOTEX SERVICE (SPAS)

A. Description

- (1) SPAS is a service provided to a sponsor other than the Telephone Company which allows a high volume of callers to be simultaneously connected to a sponsor's prerecorded and/or live program.
- (2) SPAS provides for the transport of calls between a caller and a sponsor's designated telephone number.
- (3) Callers accessing the SPAS programs will be billed any applicable charges for local or toll messages.

B. Regulations

- (1) SPAS will be furnished only where facilities and conditions permit.
- (2) SPAS will be furnished only for use with a sponsor's prerecorded and/or live program.
- (3) A written notice will be sent to any sponsor following oral notification when their service unreasonably interferes with or impairs other services rendered to the public by the Telephone Company or by other sponsors of SPAS or when the sponsor fails to comply with the regulations and requirements set forth in this tariff. If after notification the sponsor fails to make the modifications in its method of operation or in service arrangements deemed necessary in the sole discretion of the Telephone Company, then the Telephone Company reserves the right, at any time without notice, to institute protective measures, up to and including termination of service. In an emergency situation as defined by the Telephone Company, the Telephone Company reserves the right to suspend service without advance notice.
- (4) The provision of any particular program by a sponsor shall not preclude the Telephone Company from offering service to another sponsor providing the same or similar program.

9.5.3 976 INFORMATION DELIVERY SERVICE (IDS) (Cont'd)

A. (Cont'd)

2. Description

- a. 976 Information Delivery Service (IDS) consists of intraLATA service and facilities for IP provided pre-recorded announcements, interactive programs, or live conversation within the Denver and Colorado Springs LATAs. This service enables a caller, for a charge, to dial an IDS telephone number and receive an IP's pre-recorded announcement, to participate in an interactive program, or live conversation. As an integral part of the service, the Company will deliver calls and bill clients on behalf of the IP. (C)
- b. The Company reserves the right to evaluate live voice applications and any applications that do not provide continuous programming 24 hours a day, e.g., a caller service which may result in long holding times by the caller and create CO blocking. Such applications will be reviewed on an individual case basis and allowed only if facilities permit. (C)
- c. An IP is an IDS customer who wishes the Company to bill its clients on his behalf for each call billed for the IP's announcement, interactive, or live programs, and for whom the Company agrees to provide such billing. (C)
- d. The IP is responsible for establishing the IDS per call charge assessed to the caller. Calls placed on an MTS basis are subject to the MTS schedule of charges in addition to the IDS caller charge. (C)
- e. A portion of the IP Selected Price billed by the Company will be remitted to the particular IP, based upon the contract arrangement between the Company and the IP. The remainder will be retained by the Company at the rates specified herein. (C)
- f. IDS calls are not included in local flat rate service charges. When IDS calls are placed from measured or message rate exchange lines, the usual measured or message rate usage charges are not applicable, nor are such calls chargeable against any measured or message rate usage allowance. (C)

B. REGULATIONS

1. Provision of Service

- a. The provision of IDS access by the Company for the transmission of announcement, interactive or live conversation services is subject to the availability of facilities and the requirements of the local and toll network. In no event shall the Company be liable for any losses or damages of any kind resulting from the unavailability or failure of its equipment or facilities or for any act, omission or failure to perform by the Company, or its employees, or agents, in connection with this service. The Company shall not be responsible for calls that cannot be completed as a result of repair or maintenance difficulties on Company facilities and equipment, nor on equipment provided by the IP, nor for calls that are completed but cannot be billed. (C)
- b. The location of central offices providing IDS are entirely at the selection of the Company. IDS is available on a Foreign Central Office (FCO) and Foreign Exchange (FX) basis to IP's located outside the selected central office serving area at the FX and/or FCO rates and charges specified elsewhere in this Tariff provided that such service does not cross the boundary of the LATA within which the serving central office is located. (C)

- c. IDS will be furnished only when the IP contracts for as may local access lines and provides sufficient announcement equipment initially and subsequently, as may be required, in the judgment of the Company, to adequately serve all calls to a given IDS telephone number. (C)
