ORDER

Issued: July 16, 1992 ; Released: July 20, 1992

Pursuant to discussions at the prehearing conference on July 16, 1992, IT IS ORDERED that the following schedule SHALL GOVERN hearing procedures in this proceeding:

- October 2, 1992 - Completion of Discovery.
- October 23, 1992 - Exchange of all exhibits and sworn written testimony¹ by the party having the burden of proceeding with the introduction of evidence (KOKS(FM)). If witnesses are to present oral testimony, they shall be identified and a brief statement submitted as to the areas of expected testimony.

1 All exhibits will be assembled in a binder with each exhibit bearing a number with a tab on each document. An index containing a descriptive title of each exhibit shall be submitted. The exhibits will be serially numbered starting with the number 1. A prefix will be used to indicate the party sponsoring the exhibits, such as KOKS(FM) Exhibit 1. Each exhibit shall be separately paginated. In the event stipulations are entered into, they are to be executed by counsel, prepared as joint exhibits, suitably bound, tabbed, and paginated.

November 6, 1992

- Exchange of all exhibits and sworn written testimony¹ by the Mass Media Bureau. If witnesses are to present oral testimony, they shall be identified and a brief statement submitted as to the areas of expected testimony.


November 12, 1992

- Admissions Session commencing at 10:00 a.m. in the Commission's Offices in Washington, D.C., to rule on the admissibility of exchanged cases and identification of witnesses required for cross-examination.

November 17, 1992

- Commencement of Hearing, as previously scheduled, at 10:00 a.m., in Poplar Bluff, Missouri, or vicinity.
