MEMORANDUM OPINION AND ORDER

Issued: July 27, 1992; Released: July 29, 1992

1. Jupiter Broadcasting Corp. (JBC) seeks a ruling on a Motion for Leave to Amend. They filed their motion on July 2, 1992, and it stands unopposed.¹

2. JBC wants to report two items: (a) that on June 29, 1992 the Commission granted JBC's application permit for a new AM station at Jupiter, Florida; and (b) that Power Communications, Inc. (owned 2.5% by Paul J. Levine, a JBC principal) is no longer the permittee of WJAA-FM, Austin, Indiana.

Ruling

3. JBC's unopposed motion will be granted subject to two caveats. First, JBC cannot derive any comparative advantage from the matters they report. But secondly, and in addition, they will also be charged with any postdesignation comparative deterioration resulting from the amendment.²

1 Any comments on or oppositions to JBC's motion were due on or before July 15, 1992.

2 For example, for diversification of mass media purposes JBC will be charged with its Jupiter AM grant.

SO the Motion for Leave to Amend that Jupiter Broadcasting Corporation filed on July 2, 1992, IS GRANTED; AND THE ACCOMPANYING AMENDMENT IS ACCEPTED.
