On May 3, 2018, Diane Burstein and Michael Schooler of NCTA – The Internet & Television Association met with Steven Broeckaert, Katie Costello, Martha Heller, Nancy Murphy, Holly Saurer, and Diana Sokolow of the Media Bureau to discuss the status of the above-captioned proceedings.

In particular, we reiterated the view expressed in NCTA’s comments in MB Docket No. 17-105 that the Commission should, as part of its ongoing efforts to “eliminate or modify regulations that are outdated, unnecessary or unduly burdensome,”<sup>1</sup> take steps to reduce the burdens imposed on cable operators by the existing leased access rules.<sup>2</sup>
