The Association for Private Carrier Paging Section of the National Association of Business and Educational Radio, Inc. ("APCP") by its attorneys, respectfully submits, pursuant to Section 1.405(b) of the Commission's Rules, 47 C.F.R. §1.405(b), its Reply to the Comments submitted in the above-captioned proceeding.

All parties commenting in this proceeding support NABER's proposed rule revision.¹ As noted in the Comments of PageMart, Inc., the current eligibility restrictions have impaired the Private Carrier Paging industry. Elimination of the rule will not significantly impact private radio frequency utilization and will harmonize PCP rules with SMR rules. Paging users will have additional paging system options, which should result in more competitively priced paging service.

¹However, Telocator's support appears based upon its premise that some common carrier rules should also be relaxed.
