PUBLIC NOTICE

Calvary Educational Broadcasting Network, Inc., is the licensee of noncommercial FM radio station KOKS, Poplar Bluff, Missouri, and is authorized to operate on 89.5 Mhz.

The application of Calvary Educational Broadcasting Network, Inc. for a renewal of its license to operate this station in the public interest was tendered for filing with the Federal Communications Commission on November 3, 1989. After considering this application, the FCC has determined that it is necessary to hold a hearing on the following questions;

- 1. To determine whether Calvary Educational Broadcasting Network, Inc. violated section 73.318 of the Commission's Rules, 47 C.F.R. S 73.318 ("FM blanketing interference"), and, if so, the nature and extent of this violation;
2. To determine, whether Calvary has misrepresented facts or lacked candor in its statements to the Commission regarding the extent and success of its efforts to correct the blanketing interference problems;
3. To determine whether the licensee's management and operation of Station KOKS was so negligent, careless, or inept, or evidenced such disregard for the Commission's rules, that it cannot be relied upon to fulfill the responsibilities imposed on it; and,
4. To determine, in light of the evidence adduced pursuant to the preceding issues, whether or not grant of the subject license renewal application would serve the public interest, convenience and necessity.

The hearing will be held in Poplar Bluff, Missouri commencing at 10:00 a.m., on November 17, 1992. Members of the public who desire to give evidence concerning the foregoing issues should write to the Federal Communications Commission, Washington, D.C. 20554, not later than July 18, 1992. Letters should set forth in detail the specific facts concerning which the writer wishes to give evidence.

If the FCC believes that the evidence is legally competent, material, and relevant to the issues, it will contact the person in question.

A copy of the renewal application and related material are on file for public inspection from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, at the KOKS studio, 2773 Barron Road, Poplar Bluff, Missouri.
