As the Chairman and Co-Founder of Atom Tickets, I am writing to express my support for the merger of T-Mobile and Sprint. I am confident that the New T-Mobile's supercharged 5G network will promote the growth of the mobile economy and unleash the power of next-generation apps and services for consumers across the country.

Atom Tickets is a first-of-its-kind social movie ticketing app that makes it easier to see a movie with others. Our award-winning app uses wireless data to seamlessly connect users with the latest films, their friends, and our movie house and local theater partners. We also integrate other innovative services to let users buy tickets on Amazon Echo, Facebook, Google, Instagram, and other platforms. We now support six million monthly visitors and one million movie ticket sales a month.

Nationwide 5G networks will enable us to reach and support even more customers than we do today. As a major beneficiary of the 4G economy, Atom Tickets knows firsthand that ubiquitous wireless broadband networks are critical for the entire app-based ecosystem. Atom Tickets and other apps will need the New T-Mobile's high-speed, high-capacity, and low-latency 5G network to deliver the best user experience in the years ahead, too. As T-Mobile and Sprint know, consumers demand instantaneous access to everything in the mobile economy. That's why Atom Tickets offers an 'always on' experience. Our 24-hour digital ticketing system is supported by our cloud-based platform so, when consumers spontaneously decide to buy blockbuster movie tickets the minute they go on sale, or choose to take in a midnight movie, Atom is ready with their tickets. And our constantly refreshed rich media content attracts users and keeps them engaged.
