This will follow up our telephone conversation yesterday and will let you know some details about the League's voter registration campaign. Enclosed is a recent news article announcing some of the help we are getting to promote this idea.

Hertz Rentals has agreed to donate the use of a Ford van for the month of September so that the League can use it as a site to register voters. We plan to equip the van with a P.A. system (something else we are searching for) so that we can run a pre-recorded message to attract potential voters to the van. Our idea is to find someone capable of imitating famous voices who would be willing to record a message using a variety of voices which we could then air from the van. One script we thought might be good follows:

"YOUR RIGHT TO VOTE HAS BEEN PAID FOR WITH THE LIVES OF MANY BRAVE MEN AND WOMEN. TAKE FOUR MINUTES, RIGHT NOW, AND USE YOUR RIGHT! REGISTER TO VOTE IN THE NOVEMBER ELECTIONS. FORMS AND ASSISTANCE IS AVAILABLE AT THE LEAGUE OF WOMEN VOTERS MOTOR VOTER VAN."

Also enclosed is a list of places where our Motor Voter Van and volunteers will be trying to sign up people. Part of our effort involves approaching the largest employers in Warren and Washington Counties with the thought that we want to make each firm 100% employee-voter registered. The response has been tremendous, and we are most appreciative. I would like to point out that we are working in cooperation with the Boards of Election of both Warren and Washington Counties, and we are able to register any qualified New York state resident

Noting the vast expansion of broadcast facilities serving the Greater Glens Falls Marketplace in the past decade, and in analyzing the thrust of recent F.C.C. inquiries and proposed rules, we hold the diversification of breaking up an owner/operator AM/FM combo would in no way serve the public interest and would be counter to all motion in play from F.C.C rulemaking. Giving WYLR to an absentee owner would, we hold, be counterproductive. Thus diversification should play little if any part in this proceeding, except to, perhaps, give a preference to WYLR.
