
On July 11, 1988 due to our two electrical circuit breakers that control the pumps in our wells were burning out, it was necessary to put a total water ban in the Village of South Glens Falls. Your radio station was called and asked to announce our ban. It was your co-operation that made this emergency considerably easier to deal with. While our water supply was totally adequate, it was impossible to transmit the water to our transmission lines. This has been corrected and our reservoir is at full capacity. I am now lifting the complete ban on use of water hoses in the Village of South Glens Falls but due to the U.S. Weather forecast of a dry, hot summer, I am immediately establishing a partial ban as follows: Hand held hoses may be used 24 hours a day and sprinklers may be used between the hours of 5:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m. only.

Once again, I ask you to communicate this to the residents of South Glens Falls and thank you sincerely for your efforts in servicing the public with this Public Announcement!



#### Involvement in hurricane relief effort

The local drive now under way "adopting" the town of Manning, S.C., as a focus for donating supplies to Hurricane Hugo victims in South Carolina received its initial spur from local residents who saw the devastation there first-hand.

Ray Jett (above, left), Pete Jarvis (right) and Carolyn Garcia drove from Florida back to Glens Falls through South Carolina three days after Hugo smashed inland around Charleston September 22. "It looked like a war, without the fallout," says Jett.

Hugo "walked inland 100 miles," leaving "little towns the size of Argyle totally wiped out," says Jarvis.

Among calls they heard on South Carolina radio station WHKT was a little old lady still trapped in her house, Jarvis recalls. "It was a very moving call...you feel so helpless."

Back in Glens Falls, they resolved to collect supplies themselves and drive them to South Carolina, but an appearance on WWSC's "Speak Up" program drew a great response, Jarvis says, and the "Hometown USA — Adopt a Town Project" has snowballed since then.

Other organizers of the relief effort include: Bud Winchell, Carolyn's mother Carol Garcia and radio station WWSC-Y96FM.

"We're pushing for food donations," Jarvis says, not-






