I am a board member of Arkansas Relay Service, Incorporated, the non-profit group that administers the telecommunications relay service in Arkansas.

It is my personal belief and that of the hard of hearing consumers that I represent in the state, that the implementation of a three digit number to access all TRS' would both simplify and speed up the process for all users of the system.

In Arkansas, we must now dial an 11 digit number to reach the Relay Center, and there are two different numbers, one for voice users and one for those persons with speech and hearing disabilities. We are also finding that when attempting to use the relay service in other states it is often difficult to find the numbers.

Please give careful attention to this concern so that many more consumers will be encouraged to use relay services in the future.

Dear Ms. Searcy:

On August 1, 1992 I received from the National Office of Self Help for Hard of Hearing People, Inc. (SHHH) information pertaining to use of a 3-digit number to access relay services for Deaf and Hard of Hearing people. An effort is being made by SHHH and other organizations to request a designated 3-digit number which will be nationally in use and uniform throughout.

In our state of New Jersey, a total of 11 digits must be dialed for access to Relay Service. I am enclosing a sticker which lists 6 different 11-digit numbers. It is burdensome, and sometimes frustrating to find out the number when travelling out of the state. I strongly urge the Federal Communications Commission to designate one of the 3-digit numbers which remain to be allocated for this purpose.

I serve on the Advisory Board of the New Jersey Relay Service. Also serving on the board is Mr. Richard Herring, Director of the Division of the Deaf and Hard of Hearing, Human Services Department of the State of New Jersey. I serve, in addition, as an observer by invitation, at the quarterly meetings of the Advisory Council of the Division of the Deaf and Hard of Hearing.

As the New Jersey State Coordinator for Self Help for Hard of Hearing People, Inc., I am writing on behalf of the groups and chapters of this state, of which there are over 800 members. I am making this request for a universal 3-digit access number also on behalf of the thousands of people who are either deaf or hard of hearing, and those who are not hearing impaired who daily use the Relay Services.


