**JOINT MOTION FOR SUSPENSION
OF PROCEDURAL DATES**

Now comes CARNEGIE-MELLON STUDENT GOVERNMENT CORPORATION ("CARNEGIE") AND HE'S ALIVE, INCORPORATED ("HAI") (collectively, the "Joint Movants"), by their respective counsel, and hereby jointly and respectfully Move the Presiding to Suspend Procedural Dates in this proceeding for a period of thirty (30) days, or until September 30, 1992. In support whereof, the following is shown:

1. By telephone conference on August 20, 1992, the parties, upon consultation with Bureau Counsel, orally advised the Presiding Judge that they were close to arriving at a settlement of the proceeding through the submission of engineering amendments which would eliminate the mutual exclusivity between the two applications. In light of that, the parties requested, and the Presiding Judge granted, a 10-day postponement of the Prehearing Conference originally scheduled for August 21, 1992, and rescheduled it for August 31, 1992.¹

2. Carnegie and HAI are pleased now to report to the Presiding Judge that an agreement in principle has been arrived at between the parties whereby, subject to

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the approval of the Presiding Judge of both amendments, Carnegie would amend its application to reduce ERP in the direction of Murrysville and the HAI proposed transmitter site from the presently proposed 1.5 kW to 750 watts.² HAI, in turn would amend its application to specify an antenna pattern which would decrease the radiation in the direction of WRCT so as to protect WRCT's amended operation of 750 watts.

3. Consulting engineers for the parties have advised that it will take approximately 30 days for them to prepare the respective amendments. Such period of time is necessitated by the need to communicate with the antenna manufacturers concerning the antenna patterns and the construction of the requisite antennae. The parties expect to be able to submit to the Presiding Judge within that 30-day period, the proposed amendments and the showings required under 47 CFR §73.3525.

4. Counsel for the Chief, Mass Media Bureau, has been contacted concerning the intention of the parties to file this Joint Motion, and has authorized the Joint Movants to state that the Mass Media Bureau will interpose no objection to grant of the Motion.


²Carnegie expects to propose a directional antenna to achieve this result so that coverage in other directions will not be lost.


