On behalf of Family Stations Inc. ("Family"), we resubmit herewith the application for a new noncommercial educational FM station on Channel 215 at Bakersfield, California. This application now includes amended engineering material which responds to the letter from Dennis Williams, Chief, FM Branch, dated August 29, 1990 (reference 8920-JRW), returning the above-referenced application because of prohibited contour overlap with KPFK(FM) in Los Angeles.

The amended material consists of a corrected Section V-B and updated ownership interests. The coverage resulting from use of a nondirectional antenna and reduced ERP differs from that proposed in the original application by approximately 45%, and thus constitutes a minor change to the original construction permit application.

The Commission provided Family Stations, Inc. ("Family") with thirty days to correct the engineering defect and resubmit its application nunc pro tunc. However, Family did not receive its copy of the August 29, 1990 Commission letter until two weeks ago. Therefore Family respectfully requests, pursuant to Commission policy as set forth in FCC 84-366 and the letter August 29 that this application, as amended, be reinstated nunc pro tunc.




This refers to the application, ARN-810626AC, by Family Stations, Inc., filed on FCC Form 340, requesting that Station KEAR, San Francisco, California, be classified as a non-commercial educational FM station under Subpart C of the Commission's Rules.

As you are aware, the channel on which KEAR presently operates, 295 (106.9 MHz), is not in the FM band of channels reserved exclusively for non-commercial educational stations. As it is a commercial channel, a licensee is free to operate on a non-commercial basis if it so chooses. Thus, it is not necessary for you to file a formal application seeking authority to do something that you are already authorized to do. For this reason we are returning your application as unacceptable for filing. One copy will be retained in the Commission's files.

Examination of the application, however, indicates that you are fully qualified as a non-commercial educational broadcaster, since you are a non-profit educational organization and will continue to broadcast educational programming on a non-commercial basis. Having been informed of your continued intent to function as an educational station, we are placing a copy of this letter in your station's files making your intentions a matter of record.

Subsequently, in order to be formally recognized as an educational licensee, you should file for your next renewal on the appropriate educational form.

This is in reference to the above-captioned application for a new educational FM radio station in Bakersfield, CA on Channel 215B which proposes to operate with an effective radiated power (ERP) of 50 kW and an antenna height above average terrain (HAAT) of 140 m.


An engineering study performed by the staff using the licensed facilities of 110 kW ERP/863 m HAAT for KPFK, Los Angeles, CA (as authorized in application number BLED-830425AF) indicates that prohibited contour overlap will occur with KPFK. Specifically, by using the actual antenna heights above the average elevation of the radials for your proposed station and for KPFK, it was found that your proposed 60 dbu protected contour overlaps the 54 dbu interfering contour of KPFK between the azimuths 171°T to 190°T (as referenced to your proposed transmitter site) by as much as 5.8 km. This results in interference that would be received by your proposal. A copy of a computer study undertaken by the staff showing this overlap is attached.

Accordingly, in view of the foregoing, your application is unacceptable for filing pursuant to 47 C.F.R. § 73.3566(a) and IS HEREBY RETURNED. This action is taken pursuant to 47 C.F.R. § 0.283.

Please note that pursuant to the Public Notice entitled "Commission States Future Policy on Incomplete and Patently Defective AM and FM Construction Permit Applications", 56 RR 2d 776, 49 Fed. Reg. 47331, released August 2, 1984. Should you resubmit your application within 30 days of the date of

this letter with a minor corrective amendment, this application may be reinstated nunc-pro-tunc if you so request. Should you decide to avail yourself of this procedure, please review your application to be certain all items and exhibits are correct. An application returned a second time may not again be reinstated nunc-pro-tunc, as stated in the Public Notice.


