Jupiter Broadcasting Corp. (JBC) seeks a ruling on a "Motion for Extension of Time." They filed their Motion on September 1, 1992. JBC wants the time extended to file its opposition to "The First Motion to Enlarge Issues Against Jupiter Broadcasting Corp." that Robert B. Taylor filed on August 13, 1992. JBC's opposition was due on September 2, 1992. They want the time extended to September 11, 1992.

Both Taylor's counsel and Mass Media Bureau counsel consent to the request.


Ruling

JBC's motion will be granted. Unquestionably they have shown good cause for the request. However, since this is the second extension JBC has obtained to prepare and file the opposition in question (FCC 92M-916, released August 26, 1992), no further extensions will be granted.¹

¹ At the time JBC's counsel obtained the first extension, he represented that the JBC opposition was almost finished. So while he has shown good cause for a second extension, the orderly progression of this case requires that he complete and file the opposition. As the Trial Judge noted at the August 25, 1992 Prehearing Conference, the presence of three outstanding motions to enlarge may well lead to a Phase III hearing. We have to find out the answer to that possibility as quickly as we can.

SO the "Motion for Extension of Time" that Jupiter Broadcasting Corp. filed on September 1, 1992, IS GRANTED and JBC WILL HAVE until September 11, 1992 to oppose Robert B. Taylor's August 13, 1992 First Motion to Enlarge.²
