Get800 RespOrg Services, would like to second the request that was made by Mr. Quimby to postpone or delay the deadline for this Request for Comment until at very least ongoing or outstanding challenges or protests to the 833 Auction process have been resolved.

Albeit, we are a small RespOrg with a small voice by comparison to many in the RespOrg community, we are arguably the precise example of the sort that the Commission is best meant to serve and provide an equal chance to be heard.

It is our opinion that there has been a rapid amount of change since the SMS800 has been reorganized and SOMOS, Inc. formed and awarded responsibilities of the Toll Free Tariff. Much of this change has been much needed and broadly welcomed innovations. However after attempting to digest as much information as we possibly could about this proposed new method of Toll Free allocation we are left with many questions that we believe deserve more scrutiny. We would like more time to discuss and elaborate.

Our primary concerns are the measures and steps outlined in the request for comment seem to potentially set us on the road to a much less competitive market or a market in which we, as resporgs, are competing with our vendor. This coupled with the idea of the customer could bid directly with SOMOS bypassing the resporg initially and the requirements for information that has always been deemed proprietary and confidential to the RespOrg entities, now be disclosed to SOMOS and the public for that matter.

We respectfully request an extension of time to evaluate and discuss the issue further at least until we can be certain that in this case, too much change too fast, is not counter to the long term benefit of the Toll Free Industry and the subscribers we serve.
