MOTION TO DELETE CONTINGENT ENVIRONMENTAL ISSUE

Alexander Snipe, Jr., d/b/a Glory Communications ("Snipe"), by his attorney, pursuant to Section 1.229 of the Commission's Rules, hereby requests that the Presiding Judge delete the "contingent environmental issue" specified against Snipe (issue 1 in this case). This is the only issue other than the standard comparative issue specified in connection with the Snipe application. In support whereof, the following is shown:

1. Simultaneously herewith, Snipe filed an amendment and a petition for leave to amend to clear up a question raised by the Commission's staff with respect to its environmental showing as to the protection to be provided to workers at the tower site from RF radiation. That amendment is attached hereto as Exhibit A.

2. In other recent cases where an "RF radiation" matter has been raised by the staff, and an amendment as of right was filed to clear up the matter, the staff has written to the


Presiding ALJ to request that the "contingent environmental issue be eliminated from the Hearing Designation Order". See, e.g., Exhibit B, letter of W. Jan Gay, Assistant Chief, Audio Services Division, Mass Media Bureau, to the Honorable Edward Luton in MM Docket No. 91-209 (Sun City, CA).

3. Under this procedure, it is clear that deletion of the contingent environmental issue against Snipe is appropriate. Thus, it is urged that this motion be granted.

WHEREFORE, it is urged that this Motion to Delete Contingent Environmental Issue BE GRANTED and that issue 1, the "contingent environmental issue", BE DELETED.


Dear Judge Luton:
