Dear Ms. Dortch:

Pursuant to Section 1.1206 of the Commission's rules, 47 C.F.R. § 1.1206, DISH Network Corporation ("DISH") submits this letter summarizing a meeting on June 11, 2019 with Chairman Ajit Pai and Matthew Berry, Chief of Staff to Chairman Pai. Makan Delrahim, Assistant Attorney General for the Antitrust Division, and Andrew Finch, Principal Deputy Assistant Attorney General for the Antitrust Division, attended the meeting on behalf of the Department of Justice. Present on behalf of DISH were Charlie Ergen, Chairman, and Tom Cullen, Executive Vice President, Corporate Development.

During the meeting, DISH discussed its opposition to the proposed merger of Sprint and T-Mobile as currently constructed.<sup>1</sup> Consistent with its filings in the above-captioned proceeding,<sup>2</sup> DISH explained the need for a minimum of four nationwide mobile network operators (MNOs). DISH also discussed the impact of the proposed merger on DISH's market entry and its wireless buildout plans.
