AT&T Services, Inc. on behalf of its affiliates AT&T Corp., BellSouth Long Distance, Inc., BellSouth Telecommunications, LLC, SBC Long Distance, and Teleport Communications America, LLC ("AT&T") filed a Section 63.63 application in the above-referenced docket on November 13, 2017 seeking emergency authorization under Section 214(a) of the Communications Act, as amended ("the Act"), 47 U.S.C. § 214, to suspend AT&T's interstate telecommunications services as a result of Hurricane Irma, which made landfall in the Lower Keys of Florida as a Category 4 hurricane. AT&T's facilities sustained significant damage in the Big Pine, Sugarloaf, Arch Creek and Poinciana wire centers in the Lower Keys.

AT&T hereby informs the FCC that AT&T has restored service to all customers that reported service issues due to Hurricane Irma. Services have been restored either through temporary or permanent facilities throughout the impacted areas. In addition, AT&T's service levels have returned to pre-storm levels and are being sustained. As a result, AT&T no longer requires authorization pursuant to Section 63.63 to suspend its services in these areas.
