Dear FCC,

I am a low income disabled single mother of two that relies on internet for all of our needs. We get a good deal from our competitive provider, Sonic.net. As a disabled person I need the internet and so do my disabled children. We could not afford a massive hike in prices that could happen if you dismantle the Telecommunications Act.

Our neighborhood does not have access to fiber internet. Our building is a HUD subsidized 27 year old unit with copper internet wiring. We do not have the money to have the building wired with fiber. By dismantling the Telecommunications Act and cutting off or drastically increasing the price of our DSL you are directly harming every resident in my building, all of whom are disabled, and a large number of low income residents of our city.

AT&T was never a good carrier for us. Their customer service was atrocious, there were constant problems with connection, and they were too expensive. When we switched to Sonic for our bundled DSL and phone, we got a much better experience for less money.

It's time the government stopped making life too hard and expensive for the poor and disabled. Please do not raise prices or put our DSL out of business.
