Dear Ms. Dortch:

On June 17, 2019, undersigned counsel to the Wireless Internet Service Providers Association (“WISPA”) met with Will Adams, legal advisor to Commissioner Brendan Carr to discuss the above-referenced proceeding.

We emphasized the strong interest among WISPA’s members in obtaining access to 2.5 GHz spectrum and support for rules that eliminate inefficient spectrum allocation processes. With respect to unassigned EBS spectrum, we noted WISPA’s preference for an open eligibility auction designed with a 63-megahertz limit (roughly half of the EBS spectrum) on the amount of spectrum a bidder could acquire at an auction to ensure that multiple parties would be better able to compete for spectrum and in the marketplace, consistent with WISPA’s Comments in the record and the licensing scheme implemented for the Citizens Broadband Radio Service.¹
