My wife and I are small business owners and we have found that the 2-3 big broadband companies not only lack in customer service but they are gouging us by over charging for the service they are providing. After switching to a local provider (Sonic) Weve had much higher bandwidth at a far lower cost. I know that Sonic relies on the ability to lease infrastructure from AT&T in my area, and if that ability goes away Sonic will not be able to provide service to thousands of customers and certainly wont be able to expand. To deny Sonic and other local competitive providers access to this infrastructure is the definition of anti-competitiveness.
