Dear FCC,

I currently use Sonic for my DSL internet access. They use unbundled copper for my DSL line. I use Sonic because they offer unlimited data and have consumer and privacy friendly policies. This is in contrast to the only other options available in San Francisco: large carriers like AT&T and Comcast who both have consumer unfriendly data caps and privacy policies.

I would like to see more competition in my city and I aspire to using a fiber connection in the future when available in my neighborhood. As I understand it fiber service from Sonic requires them to have access to UNE services.

I would be materially affected for the worse by the changes you are considering to the 1996 Telecommunications Act. Please maintain competition by allowing smaller carriers access to unbundled copper and inter-city fiber transport elements (UNEs) so they can compete in the residential marketplace.
