Dear Ms. Dortch,

Per FCC Rule 1.1206, this letter provides notice that on July 1, 2019, Peter Pitsch, Executive Vice President, Advocacy & Government Relations, C-Band Alliance (“CBA”) and Jennifer Hindin of Wiley Rein LLC, counsel to the CBA, met with Nicholas Degani, senior counsel to Chairman Pai.

At the meeting, Ms. Hindin provided Mr. Degani with an update on, and summary of, the recent meetings the CBA has had with FCC personnel from various bureaus.¹ Ms. Hindin and Mr. Pitsch then reiterated the CBA’s commitment to clearing 200 MHz (inclusive of a 20 MHz guard band) of the C-band via a market-based mechanism designed to rapidly repurpose spectrum for terrestrial 5G operations in a transparent and efficient manner. Ms. Hindin and Mr. Pitsch also affirmed that the CBA remains committed to protecting existing customers and the C-band programming distribution ecosystem that today serves nearly 120 million American households. The meeting concluded with a discussion of timing and next steps in this proceeding.
